

We had some very special visitors from the Children's Center for Dance who performed scenes from the Nutcracker. Three of our very own students, Eleanor, Athena, and Martha,


were in the performance this year!

BODILY AUTONOMY, CONSENT, & YOUR CHILD

In January and February, facilitators from Albion and Holly's House will be talking with students about ways to stay safe when it comes to their bodies. Each year, the Diocese requires this information to be presented in schools to help prevent child abuse. Experts agree that children need to be taught about bodily autonomy and consent starting at a young age. When children understand they have the right to decide when and how to use their bodies, they learn how to be assertive, set healthy boundaries, and can recognize their own needs as well as the needs of others.

How can we reinforce this at home? The way parents teach their kids about consent will vary from one child to another. Age and maturity will also factor in. You want to keep the discussions developmentally appropriate while still being open and informative. Here are some ideas for how to accomplish this.

- Teach your child it is okay to say "no" if they do not like something that is happening to their body. If they don't enjoy being tickled or do not want to give someone a hug, they should feel empowered to stop it. Help your child find alternative ways to show affection or respect, such as a high five, thumbs up, or a fist bump.
- Educate your child about the importance of receiving permission to touch another person's body, as well. If their friend does not want a hug, they have to learn to be okay with that. Understanding "yes means yes" prepares children for the future world of romantic relationships.
- Talk with your child about the difference between okay touches that make them feel happy, safe, and loved and not okay touches that make them feel uncomfortable, confused, or scared. Even if someone you know and love uses a touch that makes you feel uncomfortable, you have the right to say no.
- Ensure your child understands that your family does not keep secrets. This applies even if the person asking them to keep a secret is someone they love and trust, even if they are told not to tell, and even if they are told that something bad will happen if they tell. This includes when a friend asks them to keep a secret involving something bad happening to the friend. Help your child understand they will not be in trouble for sharing the secret with a trusted adult.
- Have your child identify at least 5 trusted adults they could turn to for help. Make sure the list includes some nonfamily members, as well. Remind your child these adults are there to help protect them and keep them safe.
- Parental modeling is key! A great way to reinforce consent at home is by sticking firmly to your own boundaries. If you
 told your child no more screen time, do not allow them to continue badgering you until you give in. This confuses the
 message of "yes means yes" and sets your child up for pressuring others to get their way.




